TAX/BOND FUNDING

#### **ACTION AGENDA**

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Receive and discuss Broad-Based Tax/Bond Funding Strategy, deciding what if any, implementation plans the Board wishes to implement.

#### **BACKGROUND**:

While the District has managed to successfully navigate through the Great Recession, mounting pressures from increased demands for service (20% in the last two years), increased operational costs, closure of Fallbrook Hospital and deferred facility improvement/replacement have created long-term challenges for the District. Many of these needs stem back to inception of paramedic program in 1990 (a 25% increase in workforce size), which was funded at the expense of addressing other infrastructure needs, without seeking financial support from the public at that time. Prior to the recession, the District held in excess of \$6M in cash reserves; that figure is now less than half that amount and insufficient to meet contingencies, much less long-term capital needs.

### **DISCUSSION:**

Without additional financial support, the District will ultimately be faced with hard choices, which could include reducing staffing on engine companies, closing stations, increased response times and/or contracting out for paramedic ambulance services. We could also likely see an increase in employee attrition and reduced morale, which heretofore we have avoided through maintenance of sound labor/management relations and fair compensation practices. While contracting out to the State (Cal Fire) was once considered by some communities, some of those same communities are now finding even this option to be too expensive and unpredictable given the inability to control future State costs and are consequently reinstituting local fire departments (e.g. San Miguel).

What is needed is to explore the possibility of obtaining additional financial support from the community in order to maintain the same high caliber of service it has come to know and expect. Such funding would naturally focus on addressing the aforementioned challenges and could include a bond for facility improvement, a special tax to support paramedic services or a benefit assessment fee for fire protection & prevention (through possible redirection of State Fire Tax funds). SCI consultants will be making a presentation to the Board to discuss these and other possible options as well as potential next steps.

Evaluation of additional funding mechanisms will help the District to better plan for future needs in order to maintain the same level of services our citizenry currently enjoys.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Last year, the District engaged students from California State University San Marcos (CSUSM) Senior Experience program to assist with development of a social media strategy. Given the success of that encounter this year the District again reached out to CSUSM to develop a community outreach strategy. These students are teams of seniors, who are matched with projects submitted by local businesses and organizations. Students gain by working as consultants on rigorous, real-world projects that require teamwork and application of classroom knowledge. Businesses gain by receiving concentrated attention from bright, energetic teams that provide a fresh, independent look at their projects. Each student team works under the supervision of a faculty member.

#### DISCUSSION:

Students were given the task of creating a community outreach strategy to assist with expansion of the District's outreach efforts, which included a comprehensive, written They were given information about the District's current implementation plan. challenges (namely wildfire threat, closure of the hospital, increasing call volumes, deferred facility maintenance) and what could be done to adjust to them. Examples include efforts such as community risk reduction and mobile integrated healthcare, which are evolving industry trends that this agency is embracing. The desired long term goal is to communicate this information to the community to help get out in front of these problems and get the community to take greater ownership in mitigating them.
